



Bill Eddy, LCSW, Esq. developed the *high conflict personality theory* to explain the driving forces behind people who present the most challenging behaviors. He has trained over 200,000 professionals in 10 countries on understanding and managing high conflict disputes, including lawyers, judges, mediators, managers, human resource professionals, businesspersons, healthcare administrators, college administrators, homeowners' association managers, ombudspersons, law enforcement, therapists and others. As an attorney, Bill was a Certified Family Law Specialist in California and the Senior Family Mediator at the National Conflict Resolution Center in San Diego. Prior to becoming an attorney in 1992, he was a Licensed Clinical Social worker with twelve years' experience providing therapy to children, adults, couples and families in psychiatric hospitals and outpatient clinics.

At the age of fifty-two, Ellen (Ellie) Krug transitioned from male to female while living in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Although not at all easy, transitioning genders gave Ellie the opportunity for a “do-over” in life, which has included working to make the world fairer and more inclusive for all humans, particularly those considered “Other.” The author of *Getting to Ellen: A Memoir about Love, Honesty and Gender Change* (2013), Ellie has presented on diversity and inclusion to governmental entities, court systems, Fortune 100 companies, law firms, nonprofits, and colleges/universities on 1000+ occasions. Elimination of Bias: Understanding Gender Identity Issues in Your Clients and Their Children

1.0 ELIMINATION OF BIAS CREDIT APPLIED FOR

Persons who are transgender have become far more visible, which reflects greater societal acceptance. Still, of the letters in the “LGBTQ alphabet” the “Ts” (transgender persons) more often face unique challenges relative to personal relationships, public interactions, and other things that many take for granted. Being transgender herself, and as someone who formerly practiced family law, Ellie Krug can speak firsthand about the challenges that arise when a spouse or partner comes out as trans. 
