Chief Justice Lorie Skjerven Gildea

Chief Justice Gildea has served as the Chief Justice of the Minnesota Supreme Court since 2010. Prior to that she served as an associate justice from 2006 to 2010 and as a district judge in the Fourth Judicial District from 2005 to 2006. Before being appointed to the bench, Chief Justice Gildea was a prosecutor in the Hennepin County Attorney's Office, Associate General Counsel at the University of Minnesota and in private litigation practice at Arent Fox in Washington, D.C.

Representative Jamie A. Becker-Finn (40B, DFL)

Representative Jamie Becker-Finn is the Chair of the Judiciary Finance & Civil Law Committee. She also teaches Legislative Process at Mitchell Hamline School of Law and owns Makwa Coffee in Roseville. She previously worked as an Assistant Hennepin County Attorney in the Domestic Abuse Service Center. Jamie was first elected in 2016 and is a member of the People of Color & Indigenous Caucus and the Queer Caucus.

Minnesota Attorney General Keith M. Ellison

Keith Ellison has served as Minnesota's attorney general since 2019. Attorney General Keith Ellison represented Minnesota's 5th Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives from 2007 to 2019. Before being elected to Congress, Attorney General Ellison served four years in the Minnesota House of Representatives. Prior to entering elective office, he spent 16 years as an attorney specializing in civil-rights and defense law, including five years as executive director of the Legal Rights Center.
